Rabbi Amy L. Morrison 

There is a Chasidic tale that speaks of a man who is on a journey through a forest and loses his way. After several days of wandering, he encounters another man walking around that same forest, looking confused. To this one, he appealed: Can you show me the way out of this forest? The other replied: I, too, have lost my way. Each path I have taken has been wrong. But at least I know what paths not to take. Let us search for the way out together.

So often, we traverse our days unsure of where we are going. We drive to work, attend school, visit friends and family, and regularly check our social media accounts. But do we have a destination in mind regarding where and how we will experience the next 24 hours?

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Suggestions for parents of our youngest congregants

- Relax! God put the wiggle in children. Don't feel you have to suppress it in our sanctuary or chapel.
- Sit towards the front where it is easier for your little ones to see and hear what is happening on the Bima. They tire of seeing the backs of other's heads.
- Quietly explain our rituals and sing or clap when appropriate. Children learn liturgical behavior by copying you.
- If you need to leave services with your child, do so, but please come back.
- Remember that the way we welcome children in synagogue directly affects the way they respond to coming to synagogue, to God, to one another. Let them know that they are welcome in this house of worship, here, at Temple Israel of Greater Miami.

Torah portions for November

Parshat Lech L'cha: Genesis 12:1-17:27
Saturday, November 5, 2022 / 11 Heshvan 5783

- Abram, Sarai, and Lot go to Canaan. (12:1-9)
- Famine takes them to Egypt, where Abram identifies Sarai as his sister in order to save his life. (12:10-20)
- Abram and Lot separate. Lot is taken captive, and Abram rescues him. (13:1-14:24)
- Abram has a son, Ishmael, with his Egyptian maidservant, Hagar. (16:1-16)
- God establishes a covenant with Abram. The sign of this covenant is circumcision on the eighth day following a male baby's birth. (17:1-27)

Parshat Vayeira: Genesis 18:1-22:24
Saturday, November 12, 2022 / 18 Heshvan 5783

- Abraham welcomes three visitors, who announce that Sarah will soon have a son. (18:1-15)
- Abraham argues with God about the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah. (18:16-33)
- Lot's home is attacked by the people of Sodom. Lot and his two daughters escape as the cities are being destroyed. Lot's wife is turned into a pillar of salt. (19:1-29)
- Lot impregnates his daughters, and they bear children who become the founders of the nations Moab and Ammon. (19:30-38)
- Abimelech, king of Gerar, takes Sarah as his wife after Abraham claims that she is his sister. (20:1-18)
- Isaac is born, circumcised, and weaned. Hagar and her son, Ishmael, are sent away; an angel saves their lives. (21:1-21)
- God tests Abraham, instructing him to sacrifice Isaac on Mount Moriah. (22:1-19)

Parshat Chayei Sarah: Genesis 23:1-25:18
Saturday, November 19, 2022 / 25 Heshvan 5783

- Abraham purchases the cave of Machpelah in order to bury his wife Sarah. (23:1-20)
- Abraham sends his servant to find a bride for Isaac. (24:1-9)
- Rebekah shows her kindness by offering to draw water for the servant's camels at the well. (24:15-20)
- The servant meets Rebekah's family and then takes Rebekah to Isaac, who marries her. (24:23-67)
- Abraham takes another wife, named Keturah. At the age of one hundred and seventy-five years, Abraham dies, and Isaac and Ishmael bury him in the cave of Machpelah. (25:1-11)

Parshat Toldot: Genesis 25:19-28:9
Saturday, November 26, 2022 / 2 Kislev 5783

- Rebekah has twins, Esau and Jacob. (25:19-26)
- Esau gives Jacob his birthright in exchange for some stew. (25:27-34)
- King Abimelech is led to think that Rebekah is Isaac's sister and later finds out that she is really his wife. (26:1-16)
- Isaac plans to bless Esau, his firstborn. Rebekah and Jacob deceive Isaac so that Jacob receives the blessing. (27:1-29)
- Esau threatens to kill Jacob, who then flees to Haran. (27:30-45)
